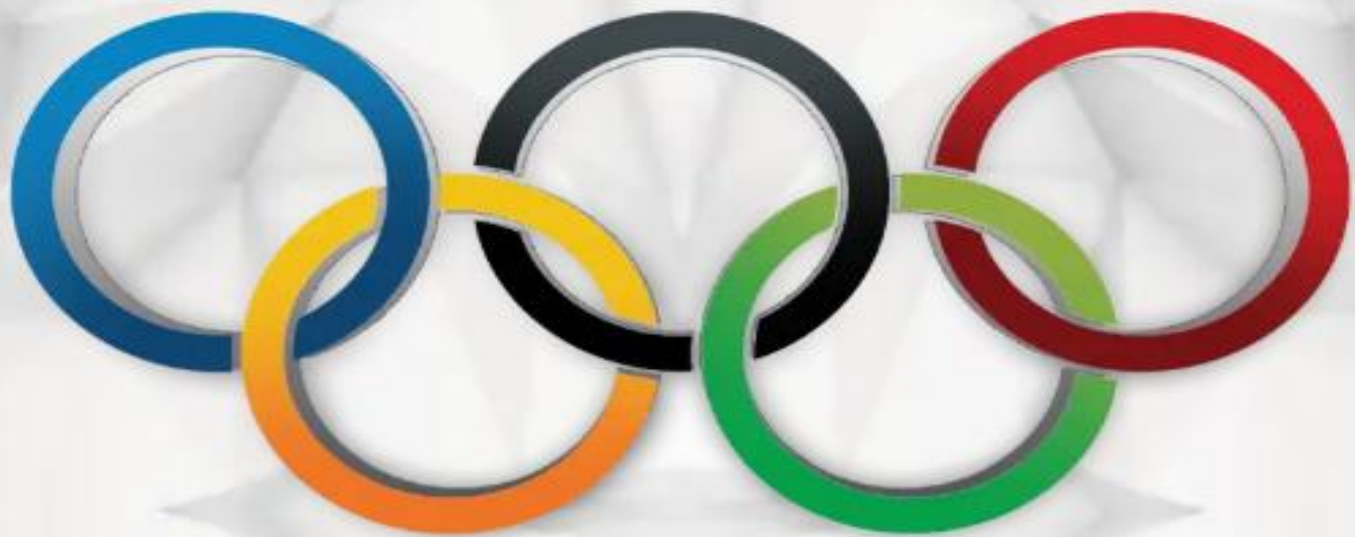

Social Studies - Tracey

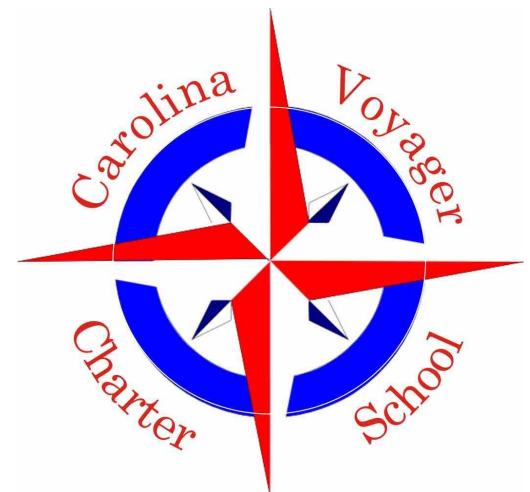
This is the end of our last full week of class. This week the students worked to connect what they have learned in Social Studies to the real world and current events. Their reports looked awesome!
